Emergency Strikes! What Do You Do?

A big aspect of preparedness is mindset. The preparedness mindset thinks through problems and comes up with solutions.

- Most scenarios offer some warning. If you're not prepared for those, like pandemic and financial collapse, shame on you.
- In an instant disaster like a terrorist attack or other sudden scenario the first thing you must do is <u>focus on your personal</u> protection.
- Follow the crowd to flee a fire or other physical disaster. Obey the instructions of emergency personnel.
- Think through different emergency scenarios and have an action plan in place beforehand.
- Pay attention to exits and other avenues of escape no matter where you are. Position yourself so you can keep an eye on the area. Monitor people around you.

What EDC Gear Should You Carry?

Your daily carry gear often will be situationdependent.

- Always pay attention to your state and local laws
- Carry a concealed weapon if you can legally do so.
- Other gear to carry includes...
 - o pocketknife
 - o flashlight
 - o paracord bracelet
 - o bandanna
 - lighter
 - lock pick/handcuff key
 - o cash

What Survival Gear Should You Carry In Your Vehicle?

Err on the side of traveling light with car gear:

- Carry a comfortable pair of shoes or winter boots. You also want...
 - o CamelBak
 - 3-day bugout bag with supplies
 - Winter coat/gloves.

What If You're At Work When Disaster Strikes?

A lot of your at-work preps will depend on your specific job and work location.

- Keep your get-home bag in your car.
- If your car is not accessible (or you don't have one), have a briefcase or other "camouflaged" means of carrying your gear that blends in.

How Do You Rally Your Family or Party?

Communication is the key to rallying your family or party in an emergency.

- Have a written plan of action for multiple likely scenarios.
- Don't have a family conference. The heads of the household should draw up the plan and share it with dependents.
- What is your kids' schools' action plan? How will you get your kids in an emergency?
- Have a fallback plan for when all else fails or the scenario doesn't fit any of your other plans.
- Make sure you have a specific rally point as part of the fallback plan.
