Survival Retreat Planning (Pt. 1)

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If You Don't Have A Plan, You're A Refugee

You can't just bug out. You need a place to retreat to, and you must plan this location.

- FEMA camps and refugee centers are dangerous places. Their goal is to create order, not keep you and your family safe.
- Having a survival plan prevents you from becoming a refugee.
- Don't believe in these five myths!

Myth #1: You Need A Bunker

Survival bunkers are cool, and we all love forts, but they're not necessary to sustain your family in a long-term survival situation.

- The warning signs of an impending collapse can happen anywhere, in any country, and affect anyone.
- Don't let the fact that you don't have a bunker, or can't afford to build one, stop you from making a survival plan. You NEED a plan.

Myth #2: You'll Go Live Off The Land In The Wilderness

This is a very common misconception, but you don't necessarily want to try and live like a pioneer. There simply aren't enough resources in most remote areas.

- Finding enough food will be an issue.
- Other people will have had the same idea and may present a problem.
- There are less opportunities for shelter in remote wilderness areas.
- Security, resources, sanitation, and medical care are also problems in remote locales.

Myth #3: You Need To Join A Remote Prepper Group

Advanced preppers, particularly, think this is a necessary step toward surviving long-term.

- There are established survival compounds, but they're very expensive.
- You'll need to have the right mindset to become part of a community like this.
- This lifestyle takes a large commitment of time, mindset, and resources on your part. They'll want to know what you have to offer, too. You need to bring something to the table.

Myth #4: You Need To Buy A Second House Or Other Property

You need some kind of shelter, but that doesn't mean buying a second piece of property.

- Obviously, buying property is expensive. This expense prevents most people from buying a retreat property.
- A second property also requires upkeep. This prevents most people from going this route.

Myth #5: You Need To Go It Alone

The "Rambo Mode" isn't necessarily something people plan on doing, but it's an assumption a lot of people have.

- Surviving alone with your family is one of the worst options for long-term survival.
- You'll need other skills, other resources, and especially other people to provide security.
