Hope For The Best, Plan For The Worst

A crisis can go on longer than expected. Your local area could also become untenable. You might even get trapped along the way in an evacuation. *For these reasons, you have to be able to bug out COVERTLY*, so that desperate people looking for resources don't prey on you.

1. Know Your Destination

Don't make noise blundering around or lost.

 Topographical maps can help you plan the most covert path to your destination along roads, trails, etc.

2. Take Advantage Of The Dark

Darkness can conceal your movements.

- Move at dusk so you are concealed but have some light to see.
- Turn off your vehicle lights as you near your destination.
- Night vision and an IR flashlight can help.

3. Be Tactical But Don't LOOK Tactical

Blue is the best color, because it's recreational and harder to see.

- Avoid orange, red, and camouflage (which is a dead giveaway).
- Pack a camo net, mosquito net, and black poncho.

4. Fast Up... Fast Down

Be ready to evacuate at a moment's notice.

 Tents are too slow. Use your vehicle or a poncho and bungee cords for shelter.

5. Don't Set Up Near Resources That Will Draw Other People

Avoid "resupply points" where people might search for goods they need.

 You need to be close to water, but not so close that you're in danger of discovery.

6. Use Natural Terrain To Your Advantage

Have a fast exit route planned and mind your environment.

- Don't silhouette yourself.
- Camouflage your vehicle whenever possible.

7. Consider A Canopy Hammock

These keep out critters while concealing you.

Very few people think to look UP.

8. Odor Discipline Matters

Avoid cooking, flames, cigarettes... any smells.

 Solid fuel tabs are one way to cook while producing less smoke and odor.

9. Light Discipline Matters

Conceal your fires and avoid bright lights.

 A red lens on your flashlight makes it harder to see at a distance. Green is easier to see.

10. Noise Discipline Matters

Avoid any loud noises of any kind.

 Avoid clanging pots... car doors... and muzzle your dogs or keep them contained.
