Stalkers, Kidnappers, And Predators Walk Among Us

They're looking for targets of opportunity. If you're being targeted, you aren't being aware. Awareness is the key to avoiding kidnapping.

Warning Signs You've Been Targeted

Nobody is going to protect you but you.

- Watch who you see when you're out. If you keep seeing the same person or people, that's a warning sign.
- You and your family have to learn to be paranoid and be aware.
- Don't RUN HOME if you are followed. Don't lead the person to your home.

Kidnap-Proofing Your Family

There ARE precautions you can take.

- Monitor your family's online activity.
- Don't invite strangers to your home.
- Don't go anywhere unarmed.
- Don't open your door for anyone you do not know. You could be shot or attacked.
- Brace the door for your foot and keep a gun behind your back if you must answer it.
- Institute standard operating procedures for your security, such as keeping your door locked and answering it armed.

Escape And Evasion Methods

If you detect you've been targeted...

- If you know you're being followed, go to a police station. Don't go anywhere isolated.
- Use crowds to protect you.

- Kidnappers exploit your child's trusting nature. Make your kids understand there is danger and that predators exist. It's hard.
- Check <u>http://www.stratfor.com</u> for sitreps. The State Department is also a good resource. Do your homework online!

Surviving A Kidnapping

If you ARE taken, remember these realities:

- Kidnappers do what they do QUICKLY. They want to grab you, zip tie you, throw you in the trunk. They must establish dominance.
- They'll beat you immediately for "shock and awe" in order to take your desire to resist.
- Your survival strategy depends on who your captors are. If you have valuable data, it has an expiration date, so you'd try to resist.
- Survival might mean simply waiting it out and not making any trouble for them.
- Take mental notes about your surroundings.

Escaping Captivity

As we said, "work the problem."

- Assess your situation immediately.
- As time goes by, the difficulty of escape increases. It's better to escape early.
- Pattern your captors. Figure out when their vulnerable times are and use that to escape.
- Lock picking skills are very valuable, but so is knowledge of terrain and the culture.
- Learn to weaponize everyday objects.
- How will you disguise yourself, feed yourself, make your escape? You have time to plan.
- Most kidnappers need isolation. If you want to make noise or get attention to escape.

Prepare. Train. Survive.
